We are against the proposed plan for an addendum Southern Traffic Route, also known as the Mid County Parkway. Splicing the Gavilan Plateau with a 'Parkway' would create a road map of community despair and environmental havoc for local residents while only boosting the socio-economic eastern segment of the San Jacinto based side of MCP at the expense of our Gavilan Hills and Lake Matthews communities. The pathway would cement our future with a grid of traffic, heavy truck use (curious if your computer model takes into account the Mexican Truck variables with their high rate of carbon emissions), one among many variables that would drastically and immediately affect our health and lifestyles.

Based on precedents your department has set and there lacks, with any trust or system value based on the transit planning procedures and practices (past, present, future) that have been utilized as well as witnessed by residents of the Gavilan Hills.
