Thank you for contacting the Morongo Band of Mission Indians regarding the above referenced project. The Tribe greatly appreciates the opportunity to review the project and, respectfully, offer the following comments.

The project is outside of the Tribe's current reservation boundaries but within an area that may be considered a traditional use area or one in which the Tribe has cultural ties (e.g. Cahuilla/Serrano territory). It appears that the DEIR has found that the proposed project will not have certain significant unavoidable adverse impacts to Cultural, Historic, or Archaeological Resources. Based upon this finding, the Morongo Band of Mission Indians has no comments at this time. The Tribe, though, reserves to right to comment upon any future development proposals or land use commitments associated with the World Logistic Center Project.
